# Our new strengths this week!

## Nursery

Our children have settled in well to our new school nursery and have been enjoying exploring all the different areas of learning.

## Donaldson

Reception have enjoyed their first full week in school. They were introduced to the text Rainbowfish by Marcus Pfister. The text has helped them to focus on the importance of sharing and developing positive friendships with their peers.

## 1 Byron

It has been phenomenal to watch the growth in maturity and independence in our class this week. We have been impressed with the way the children are learning to get themselves ready to learn in all the different subjects throughout the day!

## 2 Pilkey

During our PSHE lesson, children have been giving very thoughtful answers on how and why it is important to make friends with others. They have connected this to the weekly worship - learning about who St John the Evangelist was, and held a discussion about his special friendship with Jesus.

## 3 Wiltshire & Morris

In Year 3 we have been writing our own scripts for a cooking show set in the Stone Age! We have also been exploring friction in science and when it can be beneficial.

## 4 Banksy & Kusama

This week, year 4 explored cause and effect conjunctions to explain choices and their consequences. They linked this to their Rainforest unit, thinking about the impact of decisions on the environment. These skills will help them to write exciting dilemma stories later this term!

## 5 Beethoven & Fitzgerald

Year 5 have continued learning about the Suffragettes and have started to plan newspaper reports. The History lesson, looked at Martin Luther King Jr and the different events in his life, deciding the most significant event and explaining why.

## 6 Lennon & Williams

Year 6 have been enhancing their writing by using relative clauses and figurative language in their Blitz descriptions showing great creativity. In computing, they have been exploring 3D modelling through the use of the Tinkercad software - children have enjoyed designing and creating their own structures.
