Our new strengths this week!

Nursery

This week, Nursery explored Elmer by David McKee, learning colour names and finding colours in their environment. On Wednesday, they joined Reception to celebrate Elmer the patchwork elephant.

Donaldson

Reception continued reading about Elmer's adventures, and discussions were focused on celebrating diversity and differences. The topic concluded with a colourful Elmer Day on Wednesday, and the children were in for a surprise when Elmer himself appeared during their forest school adventure.

1 Byron

Year 1 have been really enjoying their English text 'Beegu.' The children were able to retell the story almost fluently using all the key vocabulary from the text. This week we used images from the book to create a story mountain and discussed our favourite characters and moments from the book.

2 Pilkey

This week, we have been exploring the poem 'You Are' by Valerie Bloom, in recognition of Black History Month. We learnt to recognise rhyme and understand how poems can give detailed pictures through the power of words. Click this title to enjoy the poem: '[I Heard](#)'

3 Wiltshire & Morris

This week we have been creating our own comic strips based on the book Ug, the Stone Age Genius. In maths, we have learnt how to exchange when crossing 10s and 100s.

4 Banksy & Kusama

This week, Year 4 explored free verse poetry, using rainforest sounds and their five senses to begin drafting their own imaginative stanzas. We also explored the fascinating world of invertebrates in Science and understood what makes these creatures so unique!

5 Beethoven & Fitzgerald

In Science, we continued to develop our understanding of the force of friction. Using ramps with different surface materials, we investigated which surface created the most friction by observing how toy cars moved down the ramps.

In Maths, the children also practised using inverse operations with the bar model and part-whole model to support their problem-solving.

6 Lennon & Williams

This week in Art, we have been developing our painting skills using watercolours to paint our live sketches of St John's Church. We also deepened our understanding of art terminology by exploring tint, tone, and shade. As we worked, we were inspired by the artist John Piper, who reminded us that art can help us see the world in new and meaningful ways.
