

# Our strengths this week!

## Nursery

This week, Nursery have been focusing on the classic story Goldilocks and the Three Bears. The children had lots of fun making porridge for the bears and exploring the numbers 1, 2 and 3 in Maths.

## Donaldson

Reception have been learning about the Hindu festival of light, Diwali. The children enjoyed sharing the story and drawing parallels with Christmas, the Christian festival of light. In Maths, they have been exploring the number 5 — finding 5 objects around the classroom, counting, writing, and building towers up to 5

## 1 Byron

In English, they began exploring their new comic book Traction Man. During DT, they researched how books can include moving parts such as lifting flaps, sliders and tilt mechanisms — discovering just how creative books can be!

## 2 Pilkey

Year 2 have been investigating different materials in Science and exploring houses and their structures in DT. They are using their knowledge to choose the best materials for both the interior and exterior parts of a house

## 3 Wiltshire & Morris

In English, the children have enjoyed retelling the story Quill Soup using story maps and actions, and in Geography, they identified Romania and its neighbouring countries using an atlas.

## 4 Banksy & Kusama

Year 4 have begun looking at multiplication in Maths, finding patterns between the 3 and 6 times tables. In PSHE, they discussed how to move mindfully and ways to help their bodies feel calm.

## 5 Beethoven & Fitzgerald

It has been wonderful to welcome the children back and begin new learning topics. In Geography, they explored maps to locate different places, and in English, they started reading The Explorer, using it to inspire vivid rainforest setting descriptions.

## 6 Lennon & Williams

This week, Year 6 have been exploring light in Science. They investigated how light travels and discovered the differences between opaque, translucent, and transparent materials.
