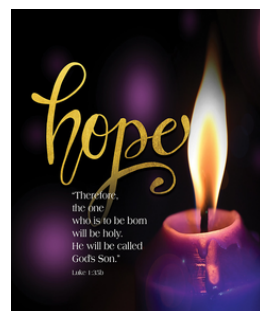
Bible Reference

When the world feels busy or distracted, help us stay rooted in Your peace.

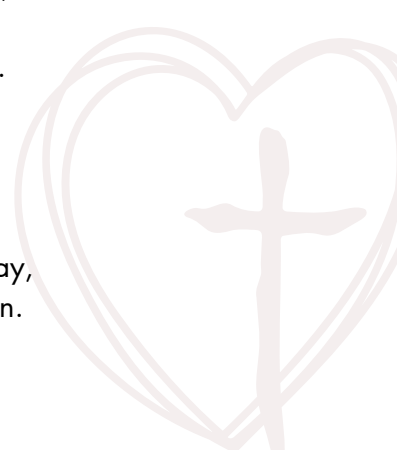
When fear rises, fill us again with hope.
