


Governors School Improvement Fund



Our strengths this week!

Nursery

In Nursery this week the children have been focusing on the traditional tale The Gingerbread Man, they designed and decorated their own Gingerbread Men. In Maths they continued their work on counting and recognising number 1-3.

Donaldson

This week, we focused on stories with repetitive language, it was lovely to hear how this helps the children sequence events and even join in when retelling the story of the text. In Maths we focused on counting, writing and recognising numbers 1-7.

1 Byron

This week, we moved on to learning numbers to 20. We explored different representations of numbers and enjoyed the practical lessons throughout the week. We used resources like numicon, dienes and unifix cubes to help us. We ended the week with representing and writing numbers 11-20 by using the dienes to show tens and ones.

2 Pilkey

This week, we have been learning how to divide, using the counting cubes to investigate how big amounts could be shared equally into groups of 2's, 5's and 10's. In PSHE we were understanding the term conflict, children worked in groups to role play different scenarios to show how our actions and words affect others.

3 Wiltshire & Morris

In DT we practised our cutting, grating and peeling skills in preparation for our soup making in a few weeks time. We have continued to explore Romania, this time focusing on the human geography of the country.

4 Banksy & Kusama

This week year 4 have been discussing the rise and fall of Baghdad during the early Islamic Civilisation. The children role played as reporters during that time to find out what caused the rise and fall. They have also worked hard during assessment week!

5 Beethoven & Fitzgerald

Year 5 have been working hard with their termly assessments across reading, spag and maths. They have now settled into swimming lessons and are improving week on week, with some children even being introduced to the butterfly stroke.

6 Lennon & Williams

This week Year 6 have been working hard creating amazing narratives based on the Hobbit. They have been utilising all the skills we have looked at especially focusing on adding suspense and tension into their work. Also, in Science, the children created their own investigations about shadows which they enjoyed.


Something to pray
